## Visit to Thelma Hulbert Gallery

Earlier this week Miss Adams' Year 10 Photography group had the privilege of working with artist Nicky Thompson at the Thelma Hulbert Gallery (THG) as part of the 'Soil Culture' exhibitions.



Nicky Thompson is a local photographer whose experimental work has been exhibited at many galleries, most recently the SpaceX gallery in Exeter.

The students started by studying all the artists' work in the current exhibition 'Soil Cultures: *Young Shoots*' which provided inspiration for the session. The Exhibition explores the importance of soil in our lives and culture. Initially, the students felt this was a strange topic but as they started to 'dig below the surface' they could see the importance of focusing on this, often overlooked, vital element of our environment. Nicky Thompson's work is inspired by Victorian techniques and her passion for natural forms and processes; the students learnt about historical photographic processes and created their own cyanotypes and photograms using plants and soil. The images they created with Nicky will be exhibited in the Gallery in the up-coming Exhibition 'Soil Culture: *Casting Seeds*'. Please pop along to visit the show which runs 16<sup>th</sup> April – 21<sup>st</sup> May. The Gallery is free to visit and also runs evening and weekend sessions for young people and adults.
