New Sports and Fitness Building - Funding Approved



New Sports and Fitness Building - Funding Approved

I am delighted to report that the College has been successful in another bid to the Education Funding Agency (EFA) for £1.8 million to build a brand new sport and fitness building. This follows on from the £230k refurbishment of our English building and the completion 18 months ago of our new £1.6 million Technology and Modern Languages building.

This new facility will link to the Phase 1 building and will replace our current 1940's gym with brand new state of the art facilities. These facilities include a new gym, dance studio, fitness suite, three classrooms, office space, changing rooms with shower facilities and an ICT suite.

We are currently in the process of getting the project up and running but it is the intention that these facilities will be open by September 2017. Therefore, students joining Year 7 next year will benefit from these superb new facilities.

More details including the floor plans will be available on the College website soon.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are not just for the unemployed

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed below you may be entitled to get Free School Meals:

- ◆ Income Support
- ◆ Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- ◆ Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- ◆ Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- ◆ The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- ◆ Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- ◆ Working Tax Credit run-on
- ◆ Universal Credit

Registering for Free School Meals is a quick and easy process - please contact Michelle Clements in the Student Office if you require further information.

Free School Meal students will have their account topped up daily with their allowance and pay for their meals in the same way as any other student, by scanning their finger at the till. You can still 'top up' your child's account in the normal way if you wish them to have extra funds available at lunchtime.

Eligible for Free School Meals but don't want to claim them?

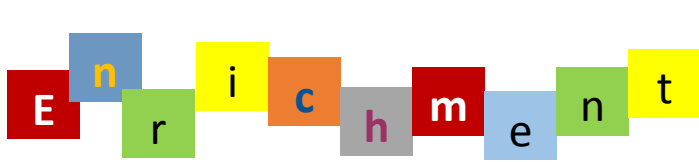
Please think again. If your child qualifies for Free School Meals, the College will also receive an extra £1,300 further funding through the Government 'Pupil Premium' initiative to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after-school activities. This additional money is available from Central Government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the welfare benefits listed above.

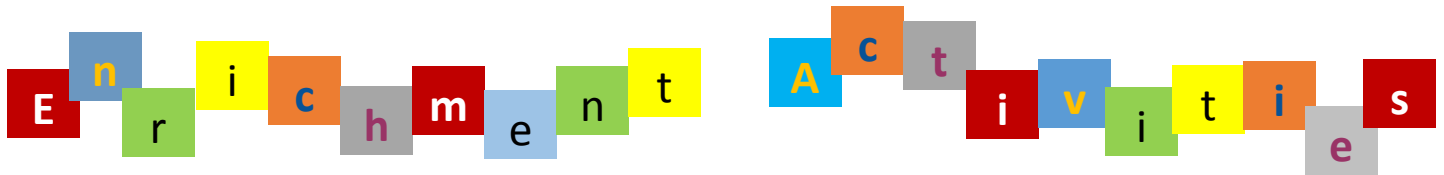

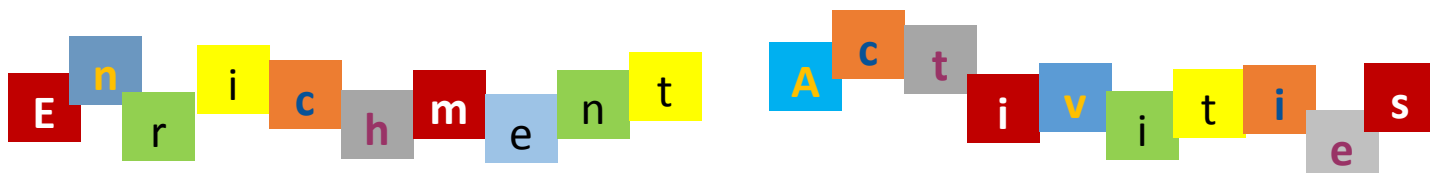
