## Mr Smith has declared the arrival of Summer, therefore:

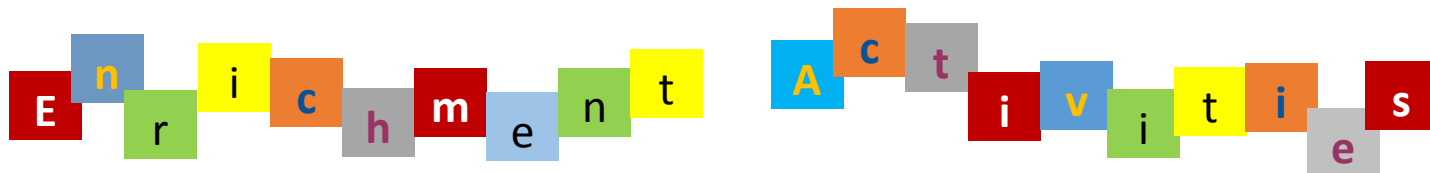
- Blazers do not have to be worn to and from College. It is acceptable not to be in possession of your blazer throughout the day and to and from College too.

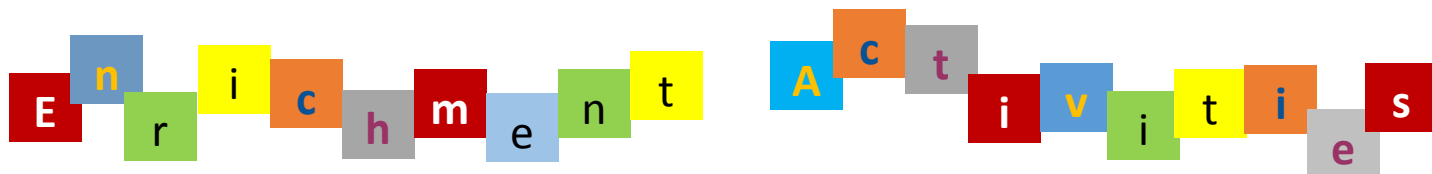

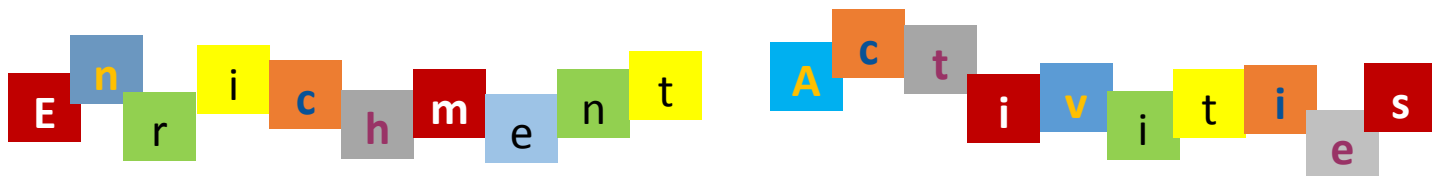
